

Golden Beavers Alumni Giving Nine Scholarships in 2013

At the Ballard Golden Beavers meeting in December, our treasurer, Hank Nornberg, recommended and the membership approved giving five (5) four year scholarships for \$3000 each, and four (4) two year scholarships for \$2000 each this year. When we then called the school and told them, they started the process of collecting applications.

On February 28, 2013 we picked up the students' applications for scholarships. The Scholarship Committee

members take each application home, read it and take notes for interviewing the students.

Our interview day, March 13, 2013, starts when we arrive at BHS at 7:45 A.M. for a meeting with the counselor, Jane Mauer. Then we receive a greeting and thank you from Principal, Keven Wynkoop.

We start at 8:15 A.M. and interview 16 to 18 students, one every 15 minutes. It is a very intense but rewarding day, because we know we want to get it right. Out of those continued on page 4


Financial support for these scholarships is derived through membership dues, memorial contributions, wills and bequests.

Upon finishing naval flight training, he spent two years assigned to the carrier U.S.S. Ranger flying F-1s over Vietnam and completing 175 combat missions. Creighton then attended Navy Test Pilot School and served as a project test pilot, where he was one of the first to fly the F-14 Tomcat. He joined the first operational F-14 fighter squadron in San Diego and was assigned two tours on the U.S.S. Enterprise. One of this missions was to provide fighter cover for helicopters evacuating the U.S. Embassy the night Saigon fell. Between tours Creighton served as a Top Gun instructor.

In 1978, Creighton was selected for the Astronaut Program. He spent 14 years working with NASA, and, in his words, "was lucky enough to get to fly the Space Shuttle three times." His first flight was aboard the Space Shuttle Discovery. After the Challenger disaster, Creighton served as an Astronaut representative helping NASA recover.

On subsequent shuttle missions, Creighton was Commander of the Atlantis and Discovery. On the second Discovery mission, his team would set a world altitude record for winged

Creighton retired from the Navy with over 500 carrier landings and left NASA after orbiting the earth 290 times. He returned home to Seattle in 1992 and stayed retired for only six weeks before taking a job with Boeing as a test pilot. He was their 737 Technical Pilot for many years. He is now retired from Boeing.

Creighton has been the recipient of many awards over the years, including the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Distinguished Flying Cross, 10 air Medals, the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, the Vietnam Cross of Gallantry, the NASA Distinguished Service & Leadership Medal, 3 United States Space Flight Medals, the French Legion of Honor and the Saudi Arabia King

Fahd Medal - and membership in the Ballard High School Wall of Fame.





Behind the Sound: A look at the preparation for The Sound of Music

Okay, well, now that it's quiet I guess we can get things going again," Director of Theatre Shawn Riley said as he overlooked the stage. Students were scuttling around the stage, moving boards, power tools, and talking to one another.

Setting up stage decorations for The Sound of Music, some of the students in the drama department were off stage, tucked behind a circular saw, whirring as it cut through large parts of plywood. A large construct of wood and nails loomed near the center of the stage, towering above the rest of the students as they swarmed around it.

"Okay now, I like that. I'm not just saying that because you've been working on it for so long," Riley said, pointing at the wooden monolith. Students were now grouped around the base of it, and the low hum of electric drills filled the auditorium as they drilled nails and screws into the base of it, securing corners and walls to it.

Some students came in and out of the black box, showing Riley pieces of costumes that they had designed, others hauled in a huge ladder that could reach the top of the looming center structure.

Entrenched among a fluctuating pile of skeletal walls and wooden boards was senior Spencer Johnson, working with a drill and making the skeletal walls whole.

Playing the part of Captain Georg Von Trapp, Johnson has a long career in the theatre department, playing roles in previous musicals such as Bye, Bye Birdie and Cabaret. In The Sound of Music, his role as The Captain is a new type of role for Johnson.

"I'm not used to playing a character who is so stiff and often immobile. It's definitely a challenge for me to play him and stand straight, arm behind my back, all military-like. I have to remind myself a lot of the time to hold myself up and to stay in character," Johnson said.

In practicing scenes, Johnson and the rest of the actors and students have progressed through Act One of the play, practicing songs such as "Do-Re-Mi," "My Favorite Things," and "Sixteen Going on Seventeen."

While practicing scenes, it's common for the actors to fall silent as they mess up a line, as Riley directs them to a different spot, or as Riley tells an actor what to put in their performance for a particular part.

The practicing process consists of blocking and reviewing. Blocking mainly features Riley directing stage movements and other fine points of various scenes, having the actors try them out, and review is doing it all again.

A few days earlier, Johnson had stood off stage, waiting to come on as Maria Rainer, played by Natalia Roberts Buceta, wandered around The Captain's villa. Maria met some of the Captain's other servants before the man himself strode assertively onto the stage, blowing a high-pitched whistle.


The Captain's children assembled in an almost military-like fashion, as he maneuvered about them, introducing each one to Maria. With the introduction of each child, the Captain would blow the whistle in a pattern designed specifically for them.

When Johnson would fumble a line or mess up an action, he would go silent and allow whoever else was in his scene to continue on with their lines. But most of the time, he was able to continue portraying the Captain without fault.

"Everybody has their own ways of memorizing lines. I'm pretty good at it because I used to have to memorize my friends phone numbers and stuff, and there are a lot of different methods for memorization. Some people associate lines with physical movements, others just pore over their lines repeatedly," Johnson said.

Riley would occasionally interject, commenting on the various actor's placements, or how they were supposed to deliver their lines. Sometimes, he would come up on stage and act out an example of what he wanted a certain actor or group to do.

The review process for the final scenes of Act One went relatively well, despite the small hiccups in placement or line delivery.

The party scene right near the end of the first act proved to be a challenge, as Riley moved a crowd of party-goers to and fro in order to make room for The Captain's and the other important characters' movements.

Following the wrap-up of Act One, Riley and company proceeded to block the beginning of Act Two, where actors filtered on and off stage, singing and pushing the story along.

Eventually, the actors got ready to leave, stepping off the stage and out of their characters. Some students would take their lines and study the parts they flubbed or missed, and others would go over their physical movements.

"I think the community has sort of come to expect a high standard from our productions and since The Sound of Music is already so well known, seeing it performed by high-schoolers will be great for the audience," Johnson said.

DECA Students Qualify to Compete at the State

Level: Eight students move forward after the classes participate in area competition

The Meydenbauer Center in Bellevue was buzzing with competition and the frenzy of triumph during the DECA Seattle Area Competition held January 11.

Seniors Bryan Quandt, Matt Rusk, Jordan Dale, Ria Conti, and Anna Gallagher; juniors Steven Agen and Taki Horiuchi; and sophomore Georgie Goldberg placed in the top eight for their category, qualifying them for the state competition.

The competition included three parts; a test and two role plays, each equaling one hundred

points. Students took the multiple choice portion in class prior to the competition.

The two role plays are presentations in which students try their best to tackle problems that would come up in the business world. These role play scenarios could be anything from an advertising pitch to a meeting between a store manager and an employee. Students are evaluated on the five performance indicators (five things about marketing that need to be addressed) as well as appearance, presence, speech, and how well the situation is addressed.

Competitors competed in subcategories of the four main DECA sections: hospitality, marketing, finance, and human resources.

Six students from each subcategory move on to state, there are also team and written competitions.

Quandt and Dale dominated their subcategory of Sports and Entertainment tying for first place in the role plays. Test scores were used as a tiebreaker and Quandt won. "It felt really good because I've been in DECA for three years and I've worked really hard at it," Quandt said.

Those who qualified for state will compete with students from around Washington on March 7th-9th in Bellevue.




Prior to retiring in 1992, Mr. Nielsen was cofounder, President and Chairman of Hazleton Corporation, the world's largest contract biological and chemical research and testing company. Hazleton Corporation, based in Vienna, Virginia concentrated its activities in the life sciences industry, providing industry and government with contract biological, chemical and immunobiological research services. The Company's clients were the world's leading pharmaceutical, chemical, agri-chemical, medical device, and food companies.

Hazleton Corporation commenced operations in 1969 as a \$200,000 start-up. When Mr. Nielsen retired in 1992, Hazleton had grown to \$165 million in sales and employed 2500 people in five countries on three continents. In 1982, Hazleton was listed on the New York Stock Exchange and in 1987, Corning, Inc., purchased the Company. Mr. Nielsen remained CEO of Hazleton for five years after the acquisition by Corning.

Mr. Nielsen is a director and co-founder of the National Eating Disorders Association. He also serves on the Advisory Board of the University of Washington Business School and the Dean's Advisory Board of the University of Washington School of Education.

He has also served on numerous Boards during his business career. Some of those Boards included Junior Achievement, YMCA, and Alliance for Education, Islandwood and the Talaris Institute. He also served as Board member of the Washington Dental Association and as a member of the Board of Trustees of Seattle Pacific University.

Mr. Nielsen graduated from the University of Washington where he received a BA degree in Business in 1960. In his senior year at the



University of Washington he was elected student body president. In 1963, he received an MBA degree from the Harvard Business School and was the recipient of that school's 2004 Alumni Achievement Award. In 2009, he received the Leadership Award from the Foster School of Business at the University of Washington. That same year, he received the McNaughton Award given annually to a Seattle Citizen to recognize civic leadership.

Mr. Nielsen is married to the former Melissa J. Mounger and has three grown children and seven grandchildren.

ast year was another good year for students Festival, winning 5 Awards of Excellence and in the Video Production Program.
