Robyn Maddess Leaves Indelible Impact at BHS

We are saddened by the passing of Robyn Maddess, a BHS special education teacher for 14 years and champion of Ballard Unified, following a battle with cancer.

"She truly loved her students and colleagues and served as an inspiration to all," wrote Principal Abby Hunt in a community update. "She is truly missed."

Unified programs are a collaboration between SPS and Special Olympics of Washington that partner students with and without disabilities together to practice and compete. Unified is dedicated to promoting social inclusion through activities, shared sports training, and competition experiences.

Ballard Unified started in 2011 due to the tireless work of a BHS special needs parent, Ron Wang, said former Principal Keven Wynkoop '94. SPS had launched a Unified Soccer league the year before and Wang partnered with then BHS Special Education Department Head, Ed Herbert, to launch Ballard's first team. Maddess was an Instructional Assistant at the time, who helped to support the program. When she became a teacher soon after, she became progressively more involved. After she became the Special Education Department Head, took over leadership of Ballard's Unified Sports program.

"Robyn's commitment to growing opportunities for students with special needs was legendary," Wynkoop said.

In her Life Skills program, she launched a bistro where students designed menus, shopped for ingredients, prepared meals and formally served them to staff members. She also got a professional espresso machine donated that allowed her students to start a coffee business that delivered

drinks to staff. These programs gave students invaluable job skills to prepare them for future employment, he said.

The commitment to growing opportunities applied to Unified Sports as well, as Maddess found partners to allow her students to follow their interests, as Ballard added Unified Drama and Unified Robotics to the already established Soccer and Basketball teams, Wynkoop said. Initially, Unified Sports programs had basically no financial or logistical support from the school district or the building, but Maddess' persistence and advocacy led to coaching stipends, more frequent gym space and overall increased support.

"Robyn was truly the best of us and her passion, persistence and creativity for opening doors for students with special needs made a world of difference in the experience of her students and their preparation for the rest of their lives. I miss her deeply and the entire Ballard community will miss her impact as well," Wynkoop said.

She was also honored as a 2020 Educator of the Year by the Ballard PTSA, as nominated by BHS community members.

allard Performing Arts (BPA) strives to provide an inclusive, welcoming, and united community for all BHS students. Aligned with this is the strong belief that ALL students should be able to equally participate in all activities -- including private music lessons -that the BPA offers regardless of their financial ability to participate.

In 2021, we had a special "ask" at the Celebrating All Things Ballard Auction in support of BPA's effort to make private lessons equitable and affordable to anyone. Our amazing donors answered the call, giving more than \$24,000 for the program.

Many students take focused lessons with a specialist concentrating on their instrument or voice part. The skills gained help with the student's technical ability, confidence, and overall musicianship. However, a significant family and financial commitment is needed to access these one-onone lessons. The BPA Directors and Boosters have long desired a way to make these lessons more equitable and accessible to all students.

When polled in 2021, two-thirds of the program's music students had taken these types of focused lessons at some point in their high school music career. However. 17% said that financial

circumstances either "Somewhat" or "Very Much" served as a barrier in accessing lessons.

The BPA Boosters wanted to ensure there were no barriers to anyone and that everyone could benefit from oneon-one coaching! The money raised in



Thankful for ALL G.A.I.N.S.

Our longtime support of the Graduation Assistance Impacting the Needs of Students (G.A.I.N.S.) program helps foster a community where students can aspire for their dreams.

As part of the program, Ballard's G.A.I.N.S. Success Coordinators **Dale Griffith** and **Malik Prince** '11 work

with Ballard High School administrators, counselors, and teachers to mentor students who are at risk for delayed graduation or dropping out due to grades, absenteeism, or disciplinary issues.





We are fortunate to have a grant from the Grousemont Foundation, through the 2027 school year, allocating \$75,000 toward a coordinator position.



This leaves a shortfall from a coordinator's \$96,000 annual salary.
